The Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation provides scholarships to the children of Marines and Navy Corpsmen attending accredited community colleges, universities, and vocational/technical institutions, with particular attention given to those whose parent was killed or wounded in action, or who have demonstrated financial need.

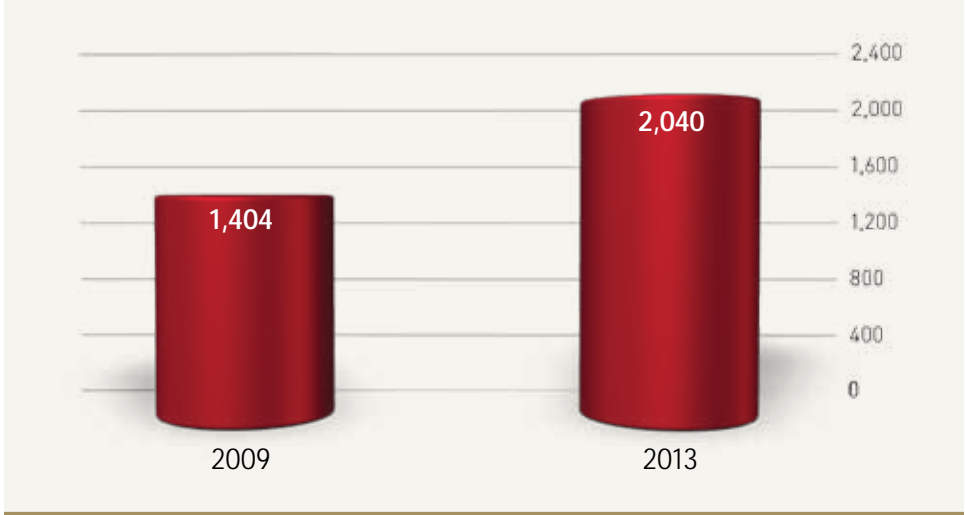
The Scholarship Foundation is the Nation's oldest and largest provider of need-based scholarships to military children, having awarded more than **30,000** scholarships valued at over **\$80,000,000** since 1962.

Our Commitment

We believe that the bedrock of our Nation's democracy and competitiveness is a well-educated and skilled workforce.

We remain committed to providing Marine Corps families with the funds they need to send their children to college and vocational or technical institutions. We recognize that American innovation and competitiveness depends upon our Nation's ability to produce citizens with the education and skills to compete globally.

Since 2009, Scholarship Foundation awards have increased 45%



The rising cost of post-high school education continues to outpace the salaries earned by our military service members. **Since 2009, Scholarship Foundation applications have increased 23%.**

Successful Outcomes

Our scholarships have substantial impact at a time when the unemployment rate for veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan is more than **9 percent**, and the cost of higher education continues to outpace the average Marine family income. Scholarships provided to military children help create a strong American workforce poised to lead in the future.

Of our scholarship recipients:

52% are first-generation college students.

45% are studying science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM).

87% are children of enlisted Marines and Navy Corpsmen.

86% graduate from their chosen degree program.
