We've been *Honoring Marines by Educating their Children™* for more than half a century.

Founded in 1962, The Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation provides access to affordable education for the children of Marines and Navy Corpsmen attending post-high school, under-graduate and career technical education programs.

In that time we've awarded nearly **50,000 scholarships** valued at **\$155 million**.



Over **2,510 scholarships** awarded to recipients from all 50 states, Washington, DC, and overseas

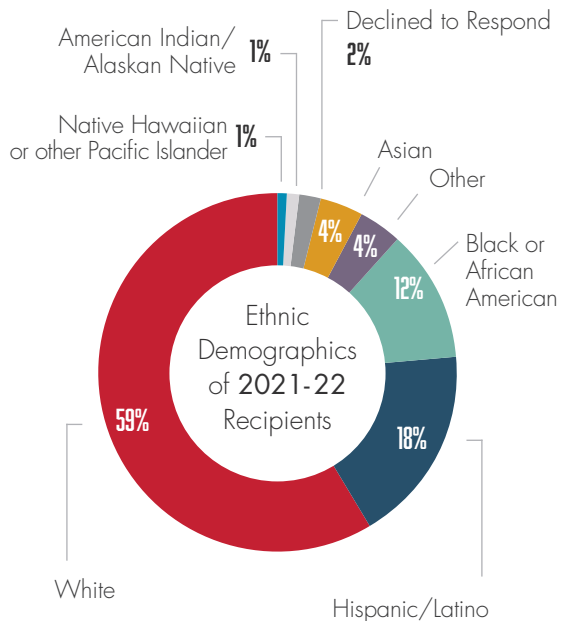

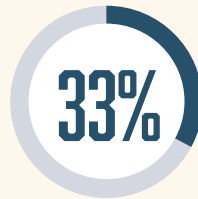
How our Scholarship Recipients Compare Nationally



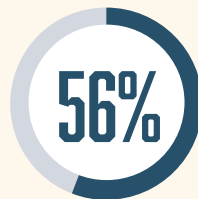
We closely track our demographics to ensure they mirror the population we serve. Our need-based scholarship program is intentionally structured to reach students who have **the most need**, not access to the most opportunity.

40 percent first-generation college students (compared to 33 percent nationally)



91 percent of our scholarship recipients graduate (compared to 56 percent nationally)
