Founded in 1962, The Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation is the country's oldest and largest provider of need-based scholarships to military children. For over 55 years, we've been providing access to affordable education for the children of Marines and Navy Corpsmen attending post-high school, undergraduate and career technical education programs.

In that time we've awarded more than 40,000 scholarships valued at over \$135 million.

\$8,200,000 in scholarship support awarded





Scholarships that Matter

- ★ \$80,000 Average cost of a four-year education (based on tuition, fees, room, board and average expenses for an in-state public institution)
- ★ \$60,000 Average family income among our Marine families
- ★ \$30,000 Average student loan debt for today's graduates

Students that Lead

- ★ 90% graduate. (Compared to 65% nationally)
- ★ 45% of our students major in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math), and health science. (Compared to 33% nationally)
- ★ 50% are first-generation college students. (Compared to 33% nationally)



90 percent of our scholarship recipients graduate or are on track to graduate (compared to 65 percent nationally)






50 percent of our scholarship recipients graduate with little to NO debt (compared to less than 30 percent nationally)
